• Natural Stone is generally classified in two groups, i.e.:

Siliceous

- Granite
- Slate
- Quartzite
- Sandstone

Calcareous

- Marble
- Travertine
- Limestone
- Onyx
- Siliceous raw materials are mainly quartz, feldspar, etc.
- Calcareous raw material is mainly calcium carbonate

Natural Stone "Birth"

Siliceous

Are formed by the cooling of magma

Calcareous

 Are formed by millions of years of pressure applied on bodies of tiny fossilized creatures

- Siliceous stones are more durable & easier to clean
- Calcareous Stones are more luxurious and warm







General Pros & Cons of Siliceous Stones

Pros

- Very durable, not easy to scratch, stain chip or burn.
- Easy sanitation for low porosity and absorbtion. Resistant to houshold acids & alcali
- Everlasting and wide selection of colors..mainly dark

Cons

- Wide, sometimes extreeme variation of patterns and color within the stone
- It can be expensive
- Requires sealing and regular maintenance.
- Limited light and warm color selection.

General Pros & Cons of Calcareous Stones Cons

- Luxurious look and synonymous with highend & elegance.
- Soft and sensuous can be molded easily in any size or shape.
- Warm colors, subtle or contrasting veining and beautiful patina as it ages.

- Porous material and will stain unless properly sealed and maintained.
- Acid & alcali sensitive, scratches and susceptible to heat.
- Wear and tear can loose away filling material (travertine).
